Movies at the Library

The Library is using the newly renovated community room adjacent to the Children's Room to show movies on the big screen. Using a video projector the picture is broadcast on a screen. A quality sound system offers top notch sound quality.

One Saturday a month, a children's film is shown. Scheduled movies are *Pete's Dragon* on Saturday, November 7 at 1:00 p.m. and *The Polar Express* on December 5.

The Tween Movie Club meets on Tuesdays after



school on November 17 and December 15 at 3:15 p.m.

These movies are for children in grades 4 through 6. The children will watch the movie and talk about what they liked and didn't like afterwards. (See page 4 for details)

Teens in grades 7 through 9 also have a special movie evening. On Wednesday, November 18 at 6 p.m., they watch *The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Universe* at 6:00 p.m.

Finally, adults have their own

group called *Matinee and Repartee*. Watch a movie and then talk about it afterwards. Conversations after the movie revolve around if it was enjoyable, thought provoking and whether the acting was well done. Watch *Chocolat* on Tuesday, November 17 and *It's A Wonderful Life* on Tuesday, December 15. Both movies begin at 10 a.m.

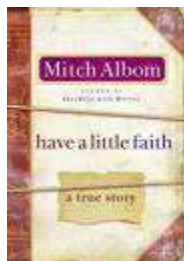

Non-Fiction:

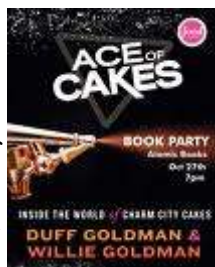
***Have A Little Faith* by Mitch Albom**



The author of *Tuesdays with Morrie* returns with this book about losing belief and finding it again. It begins with an 82-year-old rabbi who requests Albom deliver his eulogy. As Albom talks with the rabbi, he is reminded of the faith he left behind. Albom also becomes involved with a Detroit pastor who preaches to the poor and homeless. Moving between these different worlds, Albom observes how these very different men employ faith in fighting for survival.

***Ace of Cakes: Inside the World of Charm City Cakes* by Duff Goldman**

This colorful scrapbook is loaded with stories about the popular Food Network show *Ace of Cakes* and the founder of Charm City Cakes, Duff Goldman. Through interviews and photographs, the book shows how Duff built his amazing team step-by-step. Duff shows off some of the bakery's more unusual techniques and tools and offers a behind-the-scenes look at his television show.



Fiction:

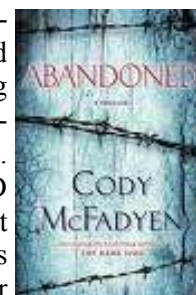
***Last Night in Twisted River* by John Irving**

The author of *Cider House Rules* and *A Prayer for Owen Meany* returns with a novel spanning five decades. In 1954, in the cookhouse of a logging and sawmill settlement in New Hampshire, a twelve-year-old boy mistakes the local constable's girlfriend for a bear. The father and boy become fugitives and flee to Boston, to southern Vermont, and to Toronto, pursued by the constable.



***Abandoned* by Cody McFadyen**

FBI agent Smoky Barrett attends a colleague's wedding and witnesses a gaunt, screaming woman, clothed only in a nightgown, thrown from a vehicle. The woman is a former LAPD homicide detective who went missing several years ago and was presumed dead. Barrett and her elite FBI team unravel the mystery surrounding this woman's disappearance and eight-year captivity. *Library Journal* reviewers recommend this novel for thriller junkies who love an edgy mystery with an unflinchingly twisted sociopath at its core.

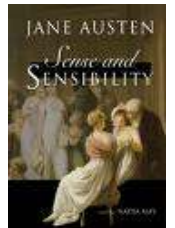

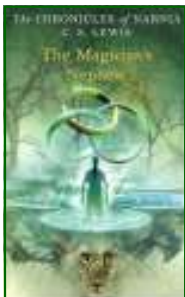

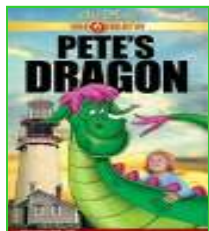
