# ADULT FICTION & NON-FICTION REVIEWS

## FICTION

### ***The Christmas Pearl* by Dorothea Benton Frank**

During a chaotic family Christmas gathering, 93-year-old Theodora reflects upon her 1920's childhood, when Pearl, the family's maid, worked hard keeping everything organized while she sang gospel favorites. When Theodora's present day maid is called away during the gathering, Pearl returns as a ghost, uncovers heirlooms, and gets the family organized.



### ***The Hearts of Horses* by Molly Gloss**

In this novel set in rural Oregon, the focus is on 19-year-old Martha Lessen. After she leaves home in 1917, Martha plans to travel from farm to farm breaking horses left behind by owners away fighting in World War I. She winds up in a small town where a rancher hires her to break his horses. Martha talks in sweet tones to the horses believed beyond repair. She begins to break horses throughout the community and gradually begins to feel a sense of belonging and respect.

### ***The Sound of Butterflies: A Novel* by Rachael King**

In this debut novel, set in the early 20th century, amateur naturalist Thomas Edgar leaves his young wife behind and sets off from England for the Brazilian Amazon to search for a rare butterfly that he hopes to be the first to find and name for his wife - the *Papilio sophia*. Thomas returns to England months later, physically weak, disturbed, and unable to speak. As his wife tries to understand the cause, her search reveals a world of corruption and violence.

### ***The Wednesday Letters* by Jason F. Wright**

A heartwarming story about two hardworking, loving Christian leaders of the community who die in each other's arms one night in the bed-and-breakfast that they own. As events begin to unfold around the funeral, their three grown children discover a treasure of family history in the form of letters that Jack wrote to his wife every week of their married lives. As they read the letters, the children discover a devastating event that was kept secret throughout their parent's marriage.

## NON-FICTION

### ***Clueless About Cars: An Easy Guide to Car Maintenance and Repair* by Lisa Christensen**

Valuable information about a car's systems, maintenance schedules, and emergencies. The author explains how and why maintenance services must be scheduled to insure the safety and reliability of vehicles. Large, clear, well labeled illustrations are included. Boxed inserts are also provided with tips, historical information, and checklists.

### ***If I Am Missing or Dead: A Sister's Story of Love, Murder, and Liberation* by Janine Latus**

Part memoir, part biography, this book explores Latus's relationships with abusive men and her eventual separation from a marriage with emotional and physical abuse. She admits she loved her husband, even as he humiliated and hurt her. Latus also tells the story of her sister, Amy, who was murdered at 37 by her boyfriend.

### ***1001 Ideas for Kitchen Organization: The Ultimate Source Book for Storage Ideas and Materials* by Joseph R. Provey**

A practical idea book on how to create a dream kitchen or reorganize one. Organizational principles and finding efficiency in the kitchen, with an emphasis on balancing accessibility with tidiness and making the most of your space, are all discussed. Details about cabinets, countertops, overhead and vertical spaces, and previously unusable nooks and crannies are also reviewed.



### ***Why Animals Matter: The Case for Animal Protection* by Erin E. Williams**

Animal experts Williams and DeMello discuss cruelty to animals on an institutional level in industries by revealing many disturbing facts. The authors show how the animal industries maximize profits and cut costs in ways that hurt both humans and animals. The case for humane treatment of animals is clearly stated as the authors examine the meat industry, hunting, the textile industry, animal experimentation, the pet industry, and animals in entertainment.
